This autumn saw the launch of Greener Bermondsey, a campaign celebrating the centenary of Ada Salter's Beautification Committee, which transformed Bermondsey in the 1920s. Greener Bermondsey followed Ada's example and gave away 10,000 free tulip bulbs.

Sheila and Carol from our TRA planted 100 of them at Ada's statue and 100 on her Wilson Grove estate. We look forward to a colourful spring!

The Tideway site at Chambers Wharf

In July the tunnel boring machine, Selina, arrived here after being towed up the Thames. She is now underground, ready to tunnel eastwards. The new super sewer will dramatically improve Thames water quality. TBM Selina was named after Dr Selina Fox, who founded the Bermondsey Medical Mission in 1904. The small clinic and 8-bed hospital provided care for vulnerable women and children.

A new Joyslide at St James's Church

Work has started on the new Joyslide in St James's Churchyard. It will open next year, exactly 100 years after the first slide was opened by Arthur Carr and Ada Salter. The original slide was the brainchild of Arthur Carr of Peak Freans, who saw children sliding on the granite slope of the church steps. The new slide was designed by architect, Fergus Carr, Arthur's great-great-grandson!
